2. OBJECTIVES AND LEARNING OUTCOMES

Objectives

- 3. They are able to discuss the differences between two or more cultures even when it comes to sensitive subjects.

- 1. They strive to understand and accept the norms, expectations and characteristics of another culture. They take these into consideration in an everyday and also in a professional environment.
- 2. They feel the need to communicate with their foreign peers and they are open to other cultures.

Independence and responsibility

1. They take responsibility for improving their cultural and intercultural competencies.

Teaching methodology

During the learning process students often work in pairs or groups to help them get to know their peers from other cultural backgrounds. This way we improve their level of tolerance, inclusion and acceptance.
