2. OBJECTIVES AND LEARNING OUTCOMES

Objectives

The course is aimed to improve the language proficiency of students who plan to continue their university studies in a Spanish-speaking country in one of their remaining terms. It is designed to prepare students to properly communicate verbally and in writing in a higher education and everyday environment, where a foreign language is used.

2. • they strive to engage in a behaviour that is acceptable in the given foreign culture and they take into consideration the characteristics of that culture in everyday life.

1. • They take responsibility for continuously improving and maintaining their language competence

Teaching methodology

We primarily use cooperation as a teaching method during the course. When working in pairs or in groups, during the continuous interaction, the students have plenty of opportunity to talk and discuss certain topics.
